ITINERARY

- **Day 1 Home City ~ Baltimore, Maryland ~ Welcome Dinner:** Depart aboard a deluxe motorcoach for Baltimore. Rest and meal stops will be made en route. Later this afternoon we arrive in the Baltimore area for a delightful three-night stay. Today an international parade of ships will sail into Baltimore to launch Star-Spangled 200, the celebration of the Bicentennial of the War of 1812, and the penning of the National Anthem. Gather for a welcome dinner at a local restaurant.
- Day 2 Baltimore City Tour ~ Fort McHenry ~ Baltimore Basilica ~ Annapolis ~ United States Naval Academy ~ Maryland State House ~ Toby's Dinner Theater: Following breakfast we embark on a guided city tour of Baltimore. Visit Fort McHenry which was instrumental in saving the city from British occupation during the War of 1812. Travel through the quaint neighborhoods of Federal Hill, Fells Point and Little Italy. Visit the first monument dedicated to George Washington and see Oriole Park at Camden Yards and M & T Bank Stadium. A stop will also be made at the beautiful Basilica of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the nation's oldest Catholic cathedral. Later today we take a side trip to Annapolis, capital city of Maryland and one of the oldest cities in the country. Enjoy free time for lunch and shopping in the historic Enjoy a guided tour of the United States Naval Academy. district of Annapolis. Established in 1845 the academy is the undergraduate college of the United States Navy. Later this afternoon we visit the Maryland State House, the oldest state capitol in continuous legislative use. Late today we return to Baltimore for an evening of good food and entertainment at Toby's Dinner Theater.
- Day 3 Inner Harbor ~ Star-Spangled Sailabration ~ Tall Ships ~ Phillip's Seafood Restaurant ~ Harbor Cruise: Enjoy breakfast at the hotel and then transfer to the Inner Harbor to visit one of the visiting tall ships. More than two dozen ships, including U.S. Navy, British and Canadian "grey hulls" and tall ships from around the globe are expected for the Star-Spangled Sailabration 2012 festivities. Gather for a group luncheon at Phillip's Seafood Restaurant. Later today we embark on a memorable Baltimore Harbor narrated cruise. Sail by Fort McHenry and to the spot where Francis Scott Key penned our National Anthem. Enjoy picturesque views of the Baltimore Downtown skyline and Inner Harbor.
- **Day 4 Baltimore Harbor Cruise ~ Journey Home:** This morning is free to explore Baltimore and the Inner Harbor. Once home to decaying factories and warehouses, the Inner Harbor is now a showplace of gleaming office buildings and the glass-enclosed pavilions of Harborplace which rise from the water's edge. Options include the National Aquarium, Maritime Museum, great shopping and wonderful restaurants. Later today we leave the Baltimore area and begin our journey home. Rest and meal stops will be made en route.
