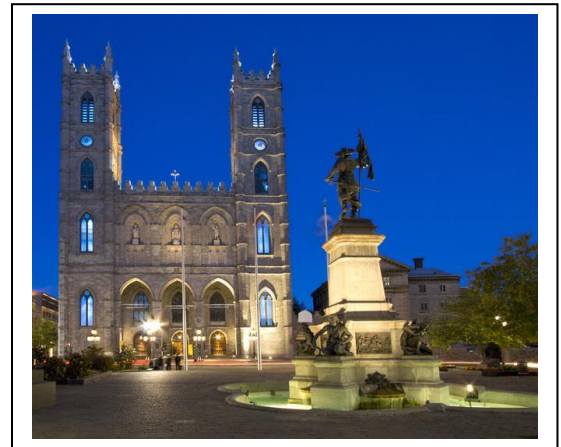

Day 1: Home City ~ Montreal, Quebec - Travel aboard a deluxe highway touring motorcoach for Montreal, Quebec. Rest and meal stops will be made periodically. Later this afternoon we arrive in Montreal for a delightful overnight stay. As Canada's second largest city, Montreal is an industrial, commercial and financial center and one of the country's major seaports. Enjoy lodging in the downtown area. Gather for a welcome dinner at the hotel.

Day 2: Montreal Sights ~ Basilica of Notre Dame ~ St. Joseph's Oratory ~ Quebec City - This morning after breakfast we explore Old Montreal. Located between the St. Lawrence River and the city centre, Old Montreal and the Old Port District were the beginning of a great city which began back in 1642. Visit one of the most magnificent French-Canadian churches and one of the largest churches in Canada, the Basilica of Notre Dame. The ornate gothic-style church features beautiful stained-glass windows depicting religious scenes and the history of the original parish. Enjoy free time for lunch in Old Montreal, which features remarkable 18th-century architecture along with the many boutiques, sidewalk cafes and public places that are alive with activities all year long. This afternoon we visit one of Montreal's most important religious shrines, St. Joseph's Oratory. The basilica was the dream of Saint Andre, a Holy Cross monk known as a healer, invoking cures for hundreds through the intercessory prayer of his patron saint, St. Joseph. Later today we journey to Quebec City for a memorable two-night stay. Majestically carved into the bluffs overlooking the St. Lawrence River, Quebec is a proud, picturesque city. Capital of the province, Quebec reflects an old-world charm and grace of another era and is the only fortified city north of Mexico. Gather for a group dinner at the hotel.

Day 3: Basilica of St. Anne-de-Beaupre ~ Montmorency Falls ~ Quebec City Sights - This morning after breakfast we travel along the scenic north shore of the St. Lawrence River to Ste-Anne-de-Beaupre. Visit the Basilica of Ste-Anne-de-Beaupre, a world-famous shrine that annually attracts more than a million pilgrims and visitors and has been the site of countless miraculous cures since the first chapel was built in 1658. Continue to Montmorency Falls for a stop at the visitor center overlooking this impressive natural attraction. Later this afternoon we return to Quebec City and embark on a guided tour through old Quebec featuring the French Quarter, Parliament Buildings, National Battlefields Park and the Citadel – official residence of the governor-general in French Canada. Enjoy the balance of the day at leisure in Old Quebec. Visit the quaint boutiques, galleries and shops of Old Town which offer antiques, leather goods, Eskimo and Indian art and native handicrafts. Take a relaxing stroll along Dufferin Terrance for a lovely view of Lower Town and the St. Lawrence Seaway.

Day 4: Quebec City ~ Our Lady of the Cape Shrine ~ Thousand Islands ~ Journey Home – This morning following breakfast we depart Quebec City and head south along a picturesque route following the mighty St. Lawrence Seaway. Stop at the Shrine of Notre Dame du Cap, Canada's national shrine to Mary. Located next to the St. Lawrence River, the Shrine and its setting offer a unique haven of peace. The Basilica of Notre Dame du Cap is a striking stone octagonal structure that accommodates over 2,000 people. Located within the chapel is the miraculous Madonna of Notre Dame du Cap statue, which in 1888, became momentarily animated. Later today we travel through the lovely Thousand Islands region of southern Ontario en route home.
