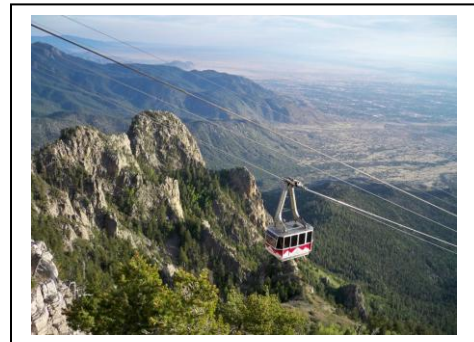

Day 1: Home City ~ St. Louis, Missouri: Travel aboard a highway coach to St. Louis for the first overnight. Rest and meal stops will be made periodically. Gather this evening for a welcome dinner at a local restaurant.

Day 2: Gateway Arch ~ Museum of Westward Expansion ~ Oklahoma City, Oklahoma: This morning after breakfast we transfer to the Gateway Arch – an inverted catenary of gleaming stainless-steel soaring 630 feet above the shoreline of the great Mississippi River. Visit the Museum of Westward Expansion which features an extensive collection of artifacts related to the Lewis and Clark expedition. Later today travel to Oklahoma City for a two-night stay. Oklahoma City offers visitors a unique blend of western American history within a sleek contemporary city appearance.

Day 3: City Tour ~ Oklahoma City National Memorial & Museum ~ Stockyards: This morning after breakfast we embark on a guided city tour of Oklahoma City. Enjoy a stop at Oklahoma City National Memorial & Museum built in remembrance of the victims, survivors and rescuers of the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building bombing on April 19, 1995. Enjoy free time for lunch and shopping at Oklahoma National Stockyards. Home to the world's largest cattle market, the stockyard area also offers numerous restaurants and popular establishments selling cowboy hats, boots and belts. The balance of the day is at leisure.

Day 4: National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum ~ Route 66 ~ Amarillo, Texas: After breakfast we visit the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum which commemorates the Western pioneers through an extensive collection of art, historic artifacts and exhibits. Later today travel into Texas along historic Route 66. Enjoy stops at Devil's Rope Museum and Cross of Our Lord Ministries and Stations of the Cross. Later today arrive in Amarillo for dinner and overnight.

Day 5: Route 66 ~ New Mexico ~ Albuquerque: Continue along Route 66 into New Mexico. Stops will be made at Route 66 Visitor Center and Auto Museum. Later today arrive in Albuquerque for the next two nights. Gather for dinner at a local restaurant.

Day 6: Albuquerque Sights ~ Old Town ~ Sandia Peak Aerial Tramway: Today after breakfast we embark on a city tour with a stop in Old Town which features shops and galleries offering Native American artwork, jewelry, food and specialty items. Later today experience a thrilling ride aboard the Sandia Peak Aerial Tramway. The 2.7-mile-long ride transports passengers above the deep canyons and spectacular terrain of the western Sandia Mountains into the New Mexico sky. Enjoy the balance of the day at leisure.

Day 7: Acoma Pueblo "Sky City" ~ Petrified Forest ~ Flagstaff, Arizona: Today after breakfast we journey to Acoma Pueblo - "Sky City", one of the oldest continuously inhabited settlements in the country. The Acomans, who have occupied this pueblo since the second century, worked fields on the plains 367 feet below their village and climbed back atop the mesa each night. This afternoon travel into Arizona and stop at the Petrified Forest. Later today arrive in Flagstaff for dinner and a two-night stay.

Day 8: Grand Canyon ~ South Rim ~ El Tovar Luncheon: The Grand Canyon is one of the world's most outstanding spectacles. Measuring 277 miles long, 10 miles wide and nearly one mile deep, the Grand Canyon is the largest gorge on the globe. Enjoy the day touring the South Rim. Several stops at observation points are made along the canyon drive with time to enjoy the Grand Canyon Village and Visitor Center. Gather for a special group luncheon at the El Tovar Hotel. Return to Flagstaff for a leisurely evening.

Day 9: Four Corners Monument ~ Colorado ~ Alamosa: Following breakfast head north through the Navajo Nation to Four Corners Monument, the quadripoint where the states of Arizona, New Mexico, Colorado and Utah meet. It is the only point in the United States shared by four states. Later today head east through Durango, Colorado and into Alamosa for the overnight.

Day 10: Ludlow Memorial ~ Prairie Ridge Buffalo Ranch ~ Limon, Colorado: After breakfast travel to Trinidad for a stop at Ludlow Memorial which honors the victims from the Ludlow massacre. Following a lunch break travel to Limon for a guided tour through Prairie Ridge Buffalo Ranch. Gather for dinner at a local restaurant.

Day 11: Kansas ~ High Plains Museum ~ Cathedral of the Plains ~ Fort Hays, Kansas: Continue east into Kansas for a stop at the High Plains Museum in Goodland. This afternoon visit lovely St. Fidelis Basilica, known as the “Cathedral of the Plains” and historic Fort Hays. Overnight in Hays.

Day 12: Wilson ~ Eisenhower Presidential Library & Museum ~ Kansas City, MO: This morning after breakfast travel to Wilson, Czech Capital of Kansas, to see the world’s largest hand-painted egg. Continue to Abilene and visit the Eisenhower Presidential Library and Museum. Later today arrive in Kansas City for the night.

Day 13: Independence ~ Truman Library & Museum ~ Ulysses Grant National Site: Following breakfast journey east to Independence, Missouri for a stop at Harry S. Truman Presidential Library & Museum. Later today visit Ulysses S. Grant National Historic Site. Gather for a farewell dinner at a local restaurant. Overnight in the St. Louis area.

Day 14: Journey Home ~ Casey, IL: After breakfast we board our coach and begin our journey home. Enjoy a stop in the quaint town of Casey which boasts to having some of the world’s largest objects. Arrive home later this evening.
